

Dear all,

After months of work, three election reform bills I drafted were co-sponsored by our GOP legislative delegates and pre-filed on November 17<sup>th</sup>.

My research on South Carolina's election laws and audit reports from other states pointed to three areas most susceptible to election fraud:

- Voter registration
- Inaccurate voter rolls, and
- Mail-in absentee ballots

As an example, 100% of the 49,718 irregular votes discovered in the forensic audit of Maricopa County were related to voter rolls or mail-in ballots or both. In Georgia, while the Fulton County audit has been held up in court, auditors already found 18,325 ballots cast with vacant addresses and 15,700 votes from people who moved out of the state before the election. Stacey Abrams was able to flip Georgia blue in 2020 partially because she took advantage of loose regulations on third-party voter registration and partially because of the Consent Decree that promoted unsolicited mail-in ballots and unsupervised drop boxes. Mark Zuckbuck's \$51 million investment in predominantly Democrat precincts also contributed to Biden's slim victory margin of 12,000 votes.

To prevent Stacey Abrams and Jamie Harrison from turning South Carolina into another blue state run by Pelosi's puppet Joe Cunningham (yes, he will be running in the 2022 gubernatorial race), my bills include:

- H 4620: Redefine "Domicile" an elector can claim as legal residence and prevent someone from registering in multiple states or counties. This bill serves two other purposes: 1) voter roll cleanup, and 2) challenges to ineligible voters [https://www.scstatehouse.gov/sess124\\_2021-2022/bills/4620.htm](https://www.scstatehouse.gov/sess124_2021-2022/bills/4620.htm)
- H 4621: Date-stamp voter registration forms to prevent election day registration and authorize the State Election Commission and Executive Director to regulate voter registration by private parties [https://www.scstatehouse.gov/sess124\\_2021-2022/bills/4621.htm](https://www.scstatehouse.gov/sess124_2021-2022/bills/4621.htm)
- H 4622: Limit the number of ballots an individual can request, witness and return (prevents ballot harvesting – there was a typo in the pre-filed bill. An individual can only apply and return two mail-in ballots, including his own), require voter ID for mail-in ballot application and return, and inform the county board of voter registration and elections when requesting absentee ballots to be sent to a mailing addresses [https://www.scstatehouse.gov/sess124\\_2021-2022/bills/4622.htm](https://www.scstatehouse.gov/sess124_2021-2022/bills/4622.htm)

Two more bills sponsored by our Beaufort County delegates will be filed in January that will strengthen voter roll cleanup requirements and electronic voting security.

Beaufort County is leading the way to strengthen our election system in South Carolina. It was a joint effort by the BCRP leadership (Kevin, Barbara and Conway), our hardworking county GOP delegates (Weston, Shannon, Bill and Jeff) and all of you, Friends of Liberty. It proves that everyone can make a difference to save America through hard-work and dedication.

Over the next month or two, we'll work with our county delegates to sign up more GOP lawmakers from other counties to co-sponsor the bills. Your calls and emails will be helpful – I will send a call-for-action email when the time comes.

In the meanwhile, the BCRP needs volunteers to sign up as poll workers and poll watchers, particularly in Bluffton and HHI. Annette of Habersham (copied here) invited Heritage Action to provide training for poll workers on Monday, December 13, from 630-830pm at The Lowcountry Living Room, 216 US 17 Alternate, Yemassee. Training will include:

- The need for election integrity and making it “easy to vote but hard to cheat”
- Recognize who's who on Election Day
- The differences between poll workers and poll watchers and how to serve in these roles
- How to find election laws in South Carolina
- Recognize fraud
- What to do if you see fraud occur

On a final note. It was honored to receive the "Vision 2024" Award ("Providing a Vision to Advance the Beaufort County Republican Party") at the same BCRP event where House Representative Joe Wilson (SC CD-2) received the 10th Robert Smalls Award.
